



Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Education

The Toormina High School Aboriginal Education Officer, Gloria Mercy, provides support for our Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander learners both in the classroom and with individualised programs and also support fot student wellbeing. Toormina High School Deputy Principal, Michelle Elliot, is resposible for the support and development of Aboriginal programs at THS.

Support for our Aboriginal students starts early with our team working in collaboration with teachers, families, and partner schools to enable a successful transition from primary school.

THS hold regular morning teas 'Yarn Ons' for community members and staff and we join the Community in celebrating NAIDOC week.

In 2020, the Nguura (gunya) was built as a respected cultural space for our students to deepen cultural knowledge and understanding and the school recognises the continuing connection of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples to Country. We are actively involved in projects and grants as they become available, these include art projects, building our gardens to include edible native plants, and landscaping projects for the Nguura.

The local Gumbaynggirr language will be taught in Year 8 in 2023. The elective courses in Gumbayngirr for Year 9-10 with Aboriginal Studies as a Stage 6 course will be offered in our curriculum. Additional Aboriginal Learning classes provide opportunities for our students to celebrate their cultural identities through Aboriginal Girls Dance group, weaving, SistaSpeak and BroSpeak.

The Junior AECG and the Student Leadership Team provide a voice for our Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander students. Students also have the opportunity to meet with community on Leadership camps. We are committed to providing individualised learning programs and applications for scholarships such as the Elsa Dixon Program and School Based apprenticeships are encouraged.



Attendance Matters!

What parents can do:

- Make school attendance a priority.
- Talk about the importance of attending school every day and the cumulative effect of regular absences and missing lessons.
- Help your child maintain daily routines, such as finishing homework and getting a good night's sleep.
- Try not to schedule dental and medical appointments during the school day.
- Don't let your child stay home unless truly sick. Complaints of headaches or stomachaches may be signs of anxiety.
- Help your child stay engaged, ask questions about what they are learning.
- Stay on top of academic progress and seek help from teachers or tutors if necessary. Make sure teachers know how to contact you. Also encourage your student to ask teachers if they feel they have missed an important lesson or need assistance.
- Stay on top of your child's social contacts. Peer pressure can lead to skipping school, while students without many friends can feel isolated.
- Communicate with the school
- Talk to teachers if you notice sudden changes in behaviour. These could be tied to something going on at school.
- Check on your child's attendance to be sure absences are not piling up.
- Ask for help from school, family, other parents or community agencies if you're having trouble getting your child to school.

Rewards Excursion to Dream World

We are pleased to announce that Toormina High School will be holding a Rewards Excursion to Dream World in Queensland on Friday 1 July for all years (COVID restrictions pending).

The criteria for being able to attend this excursion is as follows:

- Attendance for Semester 1 2022 school and in class is no less than 90% with no recorded truancies
- No negative behaviour incidents, N Awards, suspensions or warnings of suspension.

We anticipate the cost of this excursion will be approximately \$80.00 - \$90.00.

All students who apply to attend the excursion will be checked against the criteria listed above. Students who apply and have not achieved the criteria will be determined as ineligible to attend the excursion. In the event a student is deemed as ineligible or becomes ineligible prior to the excursion occurring, parents will be advised and all monies paid will be refunded by the school. Students who know that they do not meet the criteria are advised not to apply to attend the excursion.

Please note: NSW and Queensland do not have a reciprocal ambulance cover for students therefore if your child requires an ambulance it will be at parent expense.

Further details and permission note will be distributed to all students in Term 2.

Principal's Column

We had advice come through from the Department of Education about the COVID settings for schools that will start from Monday 28 February. The big change for High School's is the requirement for wearing masks for staff and students will no longer apply. Staff and students may still wear masks if they choose to do so. Our staff working with Support Unit students will still be required to wear masks after this date in line with the Public Health Orders around the Disability sector, however it will be nice for students and staff to return to some normality. Additionally, strategies such as cohorting will end which will allow us to have students across year groups travel on buses to sport together and assemblies will return. We can also start considering excursions again.

Many of your children may have reported that they have had collapsed classes or been taught by a teacher other than their normal class teacher this year. Due to a significant lack of casuals and the impact of COVID19 isolation rules, we have had significant number of classes that have needed to be covered. I am very proud of the work my staff are currently doing with many offering to take additional extra periods and playground duties for absent or sick colleagues which are above and beyond their normal allocation. In the first 9 days of school this year, we covered over 77 periods that would otherwise have not had a teacher on them at all and would have been minimally supervised. Please understand that we are doing our best, during this very challenging time, to provide high quality education to our students as professional teachers.

Last week I attended the Bonville Sawtell Lions Youth of the Year Awards. Mitchell Hickey, Ella Drewell, Phylicia Stock and Maya Farmer presented speeches and spoke on a range of topics. They also engaged in an interview process with the judges. All four students spoke amazingly well and showed great knowledge of current world affairs and perspectives. Maya Farmer was judged to be the overall winner and now will compete at the next round in a few weeks' time.

I have been asked to remind all parents that the bus bay area at the front of the school is a timed bus bay. Stopping or parking in the bus bay during the times of operation is not only dangerous to our students but may lead to a fine in excess of \$275 and 4 demerit points.

Our Parents and Citizens (P&C) committee held its Annual General Meeting (AGM) last week. Thank you to the office bearers from 2021. Sonja Lacey was elected President; Rachel Watt was elected Secretary; Tania Myers was elected Treasurer and Kirsten Chibeba was elected as the Fundraising Coordinator. Our next meeting will be held on Wednesday 16 March commencing at 5.30pm.




