

In the Creative and Performing Arts area in 2023 we sang, we danced, and we attended workshops and eisteddfods. Students could access tutors from the Coffs Harbour Conservatorium of Music.

We learnt to throw pots, create sculpture, paint. We made videos and developed photos!

We also had amazing excursions.

During Term 4 we started two High Potential Gifted Education Program (HPGE) creative arts groups in music and art to provide opportunities for all students to develop identified talent and interests. These students have been identified by their teachers as showing potential in these areas and are undertaking a program one lesson per week with skilled staff.



































Aboriginal Education programs our students participated in during 2023 included: Change the Story, a Bangarra dance workshop, Nyami Gawbarri, Oorala, Tahgara, Deadly Choices and a One Mob radio workshop.

We had a student receive the ELSA Dixon scholarship and another be selected to join the Bangarra Dance group. We held Yarn Ups at school with our community and selected students attended regular small group sessions with a tutor at school with the aim of adding 10% on top to their marks.

We combined with students and staff from Orara High School and Coffs Harbour High School each week for Cultural activities which culminated in an amazing performance at the stadium for our local primary schools. This group also welcomed Secondary Principals to their conference in Coffs Harbour.

Our NAIDOC week celebrations had weaving and games, dance and our assembly included guest speaker, Aunty Brenda Matthews, who had a profound affect on students and staff as she told her story.

We look forward to 2024 with anticipation of offering more rewarding opportunities to our students.





































































Wellbeing of students is a sustained focus at Toormina High School. This year students have participated in: Tomorrow Man, the Resilience Project, the Westmead Feelings program, the Butterfly Effect, Life Ready, LoveBites and wellbeing programs presented internally by our Student Support Officer and Head Teacher Wellbeing.

We supported R U Ok Day, Wear it Purple day, Sorry day, Kindness day and Harmony day. We will also be running the BATYR Program in Term 4 and there will be an excursion for our winning school house. The THS house system is an integral component of our pastoral care framework as are school camps, excursions and bonding days.

We are hosting extra transition visits from our primary schools with the goal of increased familiarisation of high school life and improved student wellbeing.

On staff at THS we have a Head Teacher Wellbeing, year advisers, school counsellor/psychologist, an Aboriginal Education Officer, a Wellbeing and Health In-reach nurse, a Student Support Officer, a HSC tutor, a youth worker, a Learning Support Team, an after school Homework Centre, a Supervisor of Boys, a Supervisor of Girls and an Anti-Racism Contact Officer. Wellbeing will continue to be a focus at Toormina High School in 2024.

The **Careers** faculty has organised a wide range of valuable opportunities which included: University Open Day excursions, Year 10 Careers and Postschool Options Expo, university roadshow, and regular white card courses. Information sessions - Services Australia, Australian Defence Force, Housing Industry Association, School-based apprenticeships and traineeships, and NRL vocational education and training. Work experience, TAFE Yes, Health Pathways, Fit for Service, Trade Taster, and Southern Cross University Masterclass programs.























TAS-Technological and Applied Studies subjects present creative and practical challenges and learning opportunities associated with cutting-edge subjects such as engineering, food technology, information and software technology, software design and development and textiles and design. As many of the TAS subjects are constantly evolving, students can follow career paths in diverse industries. THS students are taught the standards and proficiency required by professional leaders with a variety of industry experience across multiple disciplines.

















Science continued to be fun during 2023 with great excursions especially for our Marine Studies students. The THS farm has calves, sheep. ducks, chickens, crops and plenty of learning opportunities! The practical lessons in our laboritories are also a highlight! We also had primary school scientists visit!

During Term 4 we have been hosting a Bongil Bongil Community of Schools (BBCoS) partner primary school each day from Boambee, Sawtell, Bonville, Toormina and William Bayldon in an excursion based high school experience. Primary teachers have been teaching their students in our classrooms, giving students the opportunity to have the 'high school' experience with the support of their regular class teachers. We have also had the Science and mathematics faculties holding classes.





The Science faculty have been lucky enough to have year 4 students from Boambee Public School visit us.
Students were taught two full science lessons by THS Science teacher Tasanee Alam. Students learnt how fireworks are made, about the different parts of the Bunsen Burner and then we conducted flame tests. Students were led in small groups by our year 12 leaders. All students engaged in the science experiments and followed safe science practical laboratory protocols.

In the second lesson students learnt about the 2 different types of electricity, static and current electricity. Students blew up balloons and charged them by rubbing the balloons against their hair demonstrating static electricity!! Students set up an electrical circuit using transformers, wires, light bulbs and switches. A few cheers were heard when their lights all glowed.

We are excited to have more and more students attending THS in their youngers years and assist in helping students feel comfortable in a high school setting. The **Mathematics** Growth Team trainer has been working with the Mathematics staff over the last two years. They have been providing targeted, sustained professional learning that focusses on context specific need and is evidenced based. Staff have been supported to then embed this into their pedagogy.









As part of Toormina High School Transition program, students from the Bongil Bongil Community of Schools, were invited to participate and engage in our very first 'Creating Mathmagicians' program.

Creating Mathemagicians is an initiative designed by Mathematics teacher, Katie Griffiths in conjunction with our Toormina High School Mathematics Growth Team Trainer Jodie Hartmann.

This synergistic approach to learning mathematics aims to build a sense of belonging and connection with future year 7 students of Toormina High School by engaging participants in a range of fun and explorative mathematical activities. Qualified THS mathematics teachers designed and facilitated the program with the purpose to engage, enrich, collaborate and develop curiosity amongst the students, whilst experiencing playful mathematics.

Attending these sessions provided another opportunity in supplementation of other programs to ease the transition between primary school and high school, whilst providing the teaching staff an environment to collaborate across the schools and develop professional connections with our teaching staff.

Students from surrounding public primary schools attended THS on a Wednesday afternoon for the past 6 months to engage in this new program, building connections with their future peers and developing a positive mindset around their mathematical ability.

Staff and students enjoyed attending 'Creating Mathemagicians' so much this year, the principals are already booking in for this program 2024, with our 'Mega Maths Day' kicking of the year in February.









Our **English** staff visited local primary schools with our excellent debating students to adjudicate public speaking competitions and to demonstrate debating techniques. We also joined with representatives from each school in a forum on a Toormina Youth Hub proposal.

We hosted our Bongil Bongil primary school students to write, illustrate and publish a book in just one day!






















We will start transitioning to our new Toormina High School uniform in 2024.
