During the term 3 school holiday break, the Toormina High School community was deeply saddened to hear of the unexpected passing of CAPA teacher, Wendy Whittle.

Wendy had worked as a Visual Arts teacher since 2011, contributing to many of the schools in the Coffs Harbour region before finding her place here at Toormina High School in 2017. In term 3, 2023, Wendy commenced in a fulltime role at Grafton High School.

Wendy was a dedicated teacher who cared about the success of all of her students and her positive influence on students reached far beyond the classroom.

Wendy was the Year Advisor for the 2023 Year 9 cohort. She developed particularly strong relationships with many of these students and their carers, offering support and guidance as part of the Wellbeing team. Wendy led a number of art mural programs designed to support students in developing confidence, self-worth and peer connection. Her positive and caring nature allowed Wendy and her students to achieve great results. These fantastic murals, which can be seen around Toormina High School, will stand as a reminder of her legacy for many years to come.

Due to her compassionate nature, Wendy became an emotional support for many students over the years and was able to positively change the lives of many.

Wendy was one of the CAPA faculty family. Her positivity, infectious laugh and her banter will be greatly missed.

### SCHOOL UNIFORM

All students are required to wear only approved school uniform items. The wearing of full school uniform by all students enhances school tone and the morale of staff and students. We want the calibre and achievements of our students to be fully recognised and appreciated by the wider community, and we recognise that the dress of our students very much shapes the perception of our school by the community.

- Approved school uniform dress items are listed below.
- Hooded, coloured or printed (other than the school logo) tops are NOT part of our uniform, and are NOT to be worn.
- Families can apply for Student Assistance if they have trouble affording uniform items.
- Students unavoidably out of uniform should have a note from a parent/carer, and show it to the Head Teacher Wellbeing who may offer them clean uniform items to wear that day.
- Occupational Health & Safety Requirements stipulate that students must wear enclosed shoes at all times.
- Uniform needs to be modest at all times.
- Excessive jewellery may also present an WH&S hazard and students may be requested to remove such items.


#### Benefits of having and enforcing a school dress code

The students then got a behind the scenes look at the airport traffic control tower, watching from the tower as another plane took off, listening to all of the communication between the plane and the tower and seeing the radar technology being put to use.

Finishing the day with a look at security and the new full body scanner, allowing a much more secure way to travel. Then the wonderful team at Coffs Harbour Airport treated us to a pizza lunch as we watched the latest passengers arrive.

# Harry Wells Memorial Gala Day

The under 16s rugby league side travelled to Port Macquarie last term for the Harry Wells Memorial Gala Day that has run for 51 years! It also happened to fall on RUOK day with many different wellbeing organisations making the trip to advise young rugby league players on the benefits of talking about our issues. Personally, I thought it was an exceptional event that was run perfectly and accommodated our two sides very well with the extended travel as well as those from surrounding areas.

Our boys played three games in total coming away with a 1-2 record. Game one against Hastings finished 14-8 loss with the boys not quite up to the intensity of 9 a side rugby league. We lost the game on the edges by committing too many to a tackle to win the ruck but an early spread from the opposition saw us caught short for numbers. Post match, Degan Charman, the skipper for the day, spoke about our errors and where we could improve for game two. Taj Wilson was best on ground for game one.

Game two against the eventual winners of the day, St Joseph's was a much more intense game and unfortunately resulted in our second loss for the day 14-0. For 10 minutes the boys were in the match with a nil all score line but a failed attempted tackle in the middle led to a break by the opposition, resulting in a try in the bonus zone. Another try just before full time left us scoreless for the game, but our defence was much improved with the boys working extra hard for each other. Maddox Bird tackled his heart out that game and really stood tall when his team needed him most. I couldn't be more impressed with this young man's effort as he never took a backwards step against a much larger opposition. To put into context how good this side was. We watched them the game before run in 6 tries before the 10 minute mark.

Game three was a battle to avoid last in the pool. A few niggly injuries didn't stop the boys from wanting to finish strong against Gloucester High. They scored first with our boys trailing 4-0 early. We quickly hit back with 2 tries to take the score 12-4. Another try our way had us up 18-4 but a good fightback from the opposition had us nervous with only a few to go and up 18-8. Brayden Levy, with the game on the line, ran through two attempted tackles to run from halfway untouched, to under the sticks to give us a 25-8 victory. Roy White had an amazing game until he rolled his ankle and, once he was off, we lost our go forward. It was great to see the others step up with him and Maddox off the field.

These young men entered a competition out of our area and mixed it with some of the best of the south. I am very impressed with their attitude both on and off the field. Our captains Degan and Riley Swift, led from the front all day and didn't want ever to step off the field. Our 15s boys that represented: Taj, Maddox, Roy, Riley Hudson, Joseph Anderson all played well above their weight. The positive attitude that was displayed throughout the day is something they should all be proud of. At the conclusion of the event, the boys assisted in cleaning up before we made our way home. A big thank you to Woodsie who took the day to drive down and support the team, we couldn't have got there without the manager. It is days like these where we get to see our students excel in areas beyond the classroom and represent our wonderful school not just in our local community but also the Mid North Coast.
