Toormina High School Stage 6 Examinations Expectations of Students

- Examinations will be held in Hall unless otherwise indicated on the examination schedule.
- Students with special provisions will sit their exams in the Demountable.
- Student attendance will be recorded. Students should be at the exam location 20mins prior to start time. Students are expected to sign out when leaving school grounds after completing their exams.
- Students are expected to be in full school uniform for all examinations.
- Students must not leave (finish) the examination until 1 hour after the start of the examination nor leave (finish) the examination during the last 30 minutes of the examination.
- During reading time, students must not write, use any equipment including highlighters, or annotate their examination paper in any way. For examinations in which dictionaries are permitted, students may consult their dictionary during this time.
- Normal school rules apply during the examination period.
- Students who disrupt the examinations in any way will receive zero for that examination and be subject to other disciplinary procedures.
- Students who are absent from examinations will be required to do the examinations in a manner organised by the school. Such students will need to follow the Illness, Accident and Misadventure Procedures in your assessment book.
- Students on School Business, such as TAFE, must make prior arrangements with their Year Adviser and Deputy Principal, to complete examinations missed.
- Students will be required to be prepared for all examinations by bringing pens, pencils, rulers, calculators as prescribed by NESA for HSC exams. The school will provide writing paper.
- As required in all external examinations, students will place non-programmable watches on the desk and pens/pencils in transparent bag with no writing. These maybe checked by the examiners. Students are to check they have approved items in accordance with the NESA course.
- Food, mobile phones, iPads and other similar devices that NESA does not allow for the HSC exams are not permitted in the examination room under any circumstances.
- Students are expected to be ready to enter the examination room at least twenty minutes prior to the start of any exam and to follow all directions of staff members.
- Students are only expected to be at school when they have an examination. When they do not have an examination, students are expected to be at home during school hours studying for exams. Quiet study at school is acceptable.
