Write A Book In A Day



Their mission: to create, write, illustrate and publish captivating books within just 12 hours. These books will be included in digital online libraries throughout Australian hospitals for sick children to enjoy.

Write a Book in a Day is an Australia-wide writing competition fundraiser, organised by The Kids Cancer Project, with all funds raised going toward vital childhood cancer research to discover cures for the 950 Australian children who are diagnosed each year. The goal is for 100% survival. Our Bongil Bongil Community of Schools raised a whopping \$5961. Congratulations!

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Inclusive Education





