Gumbaynggir Traditional Weaving

Our Year 8 LOTE (Gumbaynggirr) students have been immersed in a hands-on cultural activity this term, exploring traditional weaving techniques using palm fronds and raffia. Guided by Aunty Penny and supported by Gabby, students have been learning how to create woven vessels inspired by traditional First Nations practices. The activity not only develops practical skills in weaving but also deepens students' understanding of Gumbaynggirr culture, language, and connection to Country. As they work with natural fibres, students engage in meaningful conversations about the significance of weaving as both an art form and a way of carrying knowledge across generations.

The completed vessels are a beautiful reflection of the students' creativity and respect for culture. They also serve as lasting reminders of the importance of preserving traditional knowledge. Through this process, students gain insight into the deep spiritual and cultural meaning embedded in everyday practices, strengthening their appreciation for Indigenous perspectives and fostering a greater sense of community and belonging. We are incredibly proud of the students' dedication and the thoughtful way they have embraced this rich cultural learning experience.

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Young Endeavour

Earlier this May, I was lucky enough to take part in the Young Endeavour Voyage from Sydney to Brisbane - an experience that I now know will stay with me for life.

Pushing Beyond Limits

The most powerful lesson I took away from the voyage was that you can always push yourself just that little bit further. Whether it was climbing higher up the mast, starting a conversation with someone I didn't know, or stepping up for a leadership role, I found that growth came from moments of discomfort. It was by challenging myself mentally and physically - that I discovered what I was truly capable of.

A Digital Detox and Real Connection

There's a whole world out there that you miss when you're constantly on your phone. Being disconnected was honestly one of the best parts of the trip. The digital detox gave me the chance to be fully present, and that's when the real connections happened - with people, with the environment, and with myself.

Some of my favourite memories were simple but meaningful: hours spent playing cards, strumming guitars, and singing together on the top deck, or laughing and skipping along as we dropped anchor in the Brisbane River. Moments like these wouldn't have been possible if we were all glued to screens.

Favourite Parts of the Voyage?

Everything! I was surrounded by incredible people, my shipmates, who quickly became some of my closest friends. Without Young Endeavour, I never would've met such like-minded people from all walks of life. One particularly unforgettable moment was the Community Day Sail, where we welcomed two intellectually diverse groups aboard. We, the youth crew, became the mentors, sharing what we'd learned to help them enjoy their very own Young Endeavour experience. It was both humbling and inspiring. And of course - climbing the mast. Nothing beats the thrill and the view from the top.

Would I Recommend the Experience?

Absolutely. No hesitation. If you're even thinking about applying, do it. There's never going to be a "perfect time", you just have to take the leap. You won't regret it. The magic of the program is that while you're learning new skills and being challenged daily, it never feels forced. It's fun, engaging, and professionally run - and it wasn't until I looked back that I realised just how much I'd grown.

One of the most meaningful things our captain said was: "Today our shipmates leave us, but though they leave Young Endeavour, Young Endeavour will never leave them." And that's the truth. I carry the lessons, the friendships, and the confidence I gained with me every day.

Final Reflection

"People won't remember what you said or did - they'll remember how you made them feel."

That quote stayed with me throughout the voyage. On Young Endeavour, we all made each other feel valued, capable, and connected. I'm proud of how far I've come, and even more excited for what's ahead.

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Zonta Young Women In Leadership

Congratulations to former Toormina High student and School Captain (2023), Maya Farmer, who is the 2025 winner of the Zonta Young Women in Leadership Award for the Zonta Club of Melbourne on Yarra.

The Zonta Young Women in Leadership Award recognizes young women aged 16-19 who demonstrate leadership in public policy, government, and volunteer organisations. The award encourages young women to continue participating in public and political life.

Maya's application showed that she is already an outstanding contributor to society and a strong young leader. During her schooling Maya was School Captain, Lions Youth of the Year 2023 and an accomplished public speaker. She also started an environment club at school and became involved with School Strike 4 Climate and AYCC (Australian Youth Coalition for Climate).

At the end of 2023 Maya was awarded a prestigious Hansen Scholarship to the University of Melbourne. At university Maya has continued her climate activism. She is one of 9 young people who have made a formal complaint to the UN Special Rapporteur for Climate Change that the Australian government lack of action on climate change is breaching their human rights - a project called 'Generation Justice'.

Zonta has a climate action arm and Maya will speak to the next Zoom meeting of Zonta Says Now at 3pm Saturday 14 June about her work with 'Generation Justice'.

She hopes to pursue a career in environmental law and public policy, where she can continue advocating for systemic change. Maya's dedication, leadership, and courage make her a role model for young people everywhere. Anita Milne, English Teacher

Maya Farmer, a Zonta Young Women in Leadership awardee, is one of the nine young people making waves.



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P&C Fundraiser






Calculators For Exams






