
Generous Jayde

Toormina High School has been the recipient of a load of valuable native timbers thanks to an initiative of Coffs City Council. Previously trees removed by council have been chipped but new planning sees this timber milled at the depot into a variety of usable sizes and delivered to local schools. Tony Healy of Coffs City Council has indicated that this will be a long term arrangement between council and schools.

Toormina High is currently air seasoning the timber, which includes silky oak, red mahogany and blackbutt plus assorted round backs. Following the air drying, the timber will be transferred to a drying room to complete the seasoning process. The dried timber has been ear marked for use with senior students undertaking **Higher School Certificate Industrial** Technology Timber major projects. With the cost of timber escalating, this has been a major boost to the school, enabling students to create projects with timbers which would have normally been out of reach financially.
