2012 has been a defining year for Toormina High School. I did not know how soon we would need these character traits to defend our school and its honour.

Staff, parents, the wider community and my Principal colleagues came from a standing start to speak positively about our school and to confront every accusation made by these people. I was amazed and humbled at finding out during that time and since just how much our students, staff and community loved their school and what worthy defenders they would be. I thank all of you who got involved and who are working with a ferocious passion to make this school stronger, louder and prouder.

The change it has made in me is that I will not be silent if we are wronged, I will not be quiet and I will encourage everyone to speak up to defend themselves. This attack has been transformative for our school. It has made our school stronger, happier and more committed than ever to providing the best educational opportunities for all students. With the devolution of authority and funds increasingly to school level from 2014, we will continue to reach out to all our community for your ideas, participation and your commitment and support for our school.

Mr Dillon, Mrs Kennedy and Mr Bear are staff leaving us this year. I thank them for their contributions to the life of our school. Mr Holden and Mrs Baker will return next year. My special appreciation goes again to our wonderful staff, especially to Erica Lyne and Simon McKinney who are outstanding practitioners and friends as Deputy Principals at our school. Again, thank you to the P&C and retiring President Kevin Jeffrey who is a stalwart in supporting our school and its students.

We look forward to 2013 with enthusiasm and with a new certainty about the respect and love the community has for our school and for its students and staff. We will be working towards developing the NSW version of the Australian Curriculum for implementation during next year, we will be hosting the Bongil Bongil Community of Schools' first Musical in June and we will be educating our students to be their very best selves.
