On Friday 9 November I had the pleasure of joining the students and staff of Toormina High School in commemorating Armistice Day. The assembly was led by the student leadership team who did an outstanding job.

One of the highlights of the ceremony was a very poignant and thoughtful poem, 'War', written and read by student Tanisha Giulati. The choral group performed 'In Flanders Fields' and Brenton Knight's rendition of 'The Last Post' was very moving.

I also took the opportunity to tour the school and chat with students and staff. I was very impressed by the '10% on top team' who are working hard to improve their outcomes – that is setting and achieving outstanding outcomes for Aboriginal students.

At Toormina High the Year 11 students take on the leadership responsibilities throughout the school allowing Year 12 students to focus on their HSC studies. Over morning tea they shared their thoughts about Toormina High, with common themes emerging about the caring support of their teachers and students' compassionate care for each other.

Evidence of these themes is everywhere in the school and have not developed by accident. Liz and staff have developed a package which recognises the importance on meeting the needs of the 'whole person'. Developing student skills and supporting students as they develop these skills happens in real, day to day situations.

While student outcome data is often the modern measure of schools it is important to experience the culture, tone and feel of a school to complete that measure. We have outstanding schools right across the North Coast and Toormina is clearly one of these. It is so exciting that students and staff from across all our schools are helping contribute the creative ideas and musical numbers that will be included.


