Year 9 participated in the Toormina High School Love Bites program in weeks 3, 4 and 5 of this term. The maturity and level of participation displayed by year 9 throughout the program was excellent. Love Bites is a respectful relationships program that focuses on identifying characteristics of a healthy relationship as opposed to an

unhealthy relationship. Our year 9 students are developing the skills to ascertain what a safe, equal and healthy relationship is; respectful conflict resolution skills; and problem-solving abilities.

The 'Love Bites' program consisted of a morning session involving two interactive educational workshops on Domestic and Family Violence and Sexual Assault. In the afternoon the students participated in an art workshop where they were able to express their ideas on canvas. These paintings will be on display around the school over the next few weeks.

A huge thank you is extended to our wonderful Mid North Coast Health workers and educators and Senior Constable Snow for presenting Love Bites.

On Wednesday, 12th October year 8 students joined Celtic Thunder's Ray and Colin for a day of medieval merriment. In the session we were enlightened to the happenings of medieval Europe focusing mainly on Scotland, Wales, Ireland and England.

The year 8 students had a chance to experience and handle weaponry from medieval times witnessing long bows in action and holding replica weaponry in a battle stance while performing a war cry of the students' own invention.

Six of the year 8 students got a taste of what peasant life was like dressing in traditional peasant clothing. One student being accused of witchcraft and another suffering from the plague. Later the students performed a short skit for the rest of the group resulting in a peasant boy being locked in the stocks for stealing a piece of cloth. The costumes provided by Ray and Colin offered a first hand experience of the attire of a male and female peasant, a lady-in-waiting, a knight and a monk or friar. Towards the end of the performance a student was dressed as a plague doctor wearing his raven costume and mask in order to scare the plague demons away.

The day was fun, educational and very enjoyable. On behalf of year 8 we would like to thank everyone who had a hand in making this day possible. We wish it could have lasted longer.

The industries visited were KTR Engineering Toormina, Brown and Hurley Trucks Coffs Harbour, Faircloth and Reynolds Coffs Harbour and Total Gardens Coffs Harbour. The female students were made welcome at all venues and were given a tour of each facility. They particularly enjoyed the talk by the two female fire fighters from Sawtell Fire Station and the 'hands on' tiling workshop.

The girls were inspired to possibly consider a 'non-traditional' trade as a career pathway in the future. Thanks to Mrs Dionne Court from CHHS, who helped organise the day.
