BroSpeak, a cultural and mentoring program run at THS, has a strong cultural focus and is designed to inspire and motivate young Aboriginal men about the importance of education. BroSpeak creates a safe environment for young men by drawing on the traditional methods of men's business.

The program also tackles a range of social issues head-on including grief and loss, mental health, nutrition, alcohol (and other drugs), sexual health, gambling and self-esteem.

ENERGY DRINKS

We are concerned as some students are buying energy drinks on their way to school. We would like to share some information so parents can discuss these drinks with their student as they may not be aware of their consumption.

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The major health concern surrounding 'energy' drinks is their high caffeine content. Caffeine is an addictive substance that can affect the heart and nervous system. While it may temporarily help you overcome symptoms such as tiredness and restore alertness, it can have other negative side effects, especially in children and adolescents.

Negative or adverse effects of caffeine can include:

- Difficulty concentrating
- Difficulty sleeping
- 🗆 Insomnia
- 🗆 Headache
- Rapid heart rate

Anxiety

Due to their smaller body weight, children are at greater risk than adults of developing these adverse symptoms. Energy drinks are low in nutrition value and high in kilojoules, and they may have harmful effects on children and adolescents including increasing risk of excessive weight gain, increasing heart rate and increasing anxiety.

He is a dad, a businessman and just an ordinary everyday guy. What people don't know about him, is that he also finds the time to organise fundraising charity soccer matches and other activities to help raise money for homeless youth in Coffs Harbour. He doesn't gain anything from this, but the fulfilment of seeing other people's live good lives and work through their difficult situations. This is a big reward for him.

This year he came up with the idea of starting up a soccer academy to help and provide not only for the homeless, but also refugees, people less able-bodied and everyday people like us. What he does truly amazes and inspires me to work harder to be a better person.

This year was the 4th annual soccer charity match he has organised and over those four years he has raised more than eighty thousand dollars for Wesley Mission to help homeless youth. He has donated every bit of this to them, to try to give them better lives through providing basic needs that we sometimes take for granted. Some of the great things he has achieved include enabliing 22 young disadvantaged youth to obtain their drivers licenses, provided furniture and white goods for housing, as well as giving away gift packs at Christmas time.

I believe our society needs more people like Matt because he is a humble man with big dreams, just wanting to do the best for other people not as fortunate as us. He is a true hero!
