Toormina High School Aboriginal School Learning Support Officer, Darryl Lockwood,

recently participated in the collaborative project 'Stories & Songs of the People', an international Indigenous gathering in the sacred Black Hills of South Dakota in the United States of America. This was an amazing opportunity for Darryl, performing as part of the Gumbaynggirr dance group, Wadja Naalu.

Darryl learnt about the connection between people of different cultures. People shared stories, songs, dances, experiences, cultural practices. They considered what it means to be an Indigenous person today, and also how to be a stronger Indigenous person through wisdom and smarter choices. Elders shared their incredible stories and talked of the cultural obligations to share knowledge. Darryl said the shared experiences of issues like intergenerational trauma has seen the Native Americans focus on encouraging young people to seek out their Elders for guidance to enable development and strength. The need for young people to access this guidance at the time when they are ready to receive it was particularly pertinent to Darryl through his work at Toormina High School. 'Our power, our impact, our ability to help, is not ours to keep but is ours to share' was one of the Elder's philosophy.

Darryl describes the power of cultural knowledge in combination with a solid education as 'twice as deadly'!

No doubt our Aboriginal Boys Dance Group and Bro Speak participants will learn and be enriched by Darryl's amazing experience!

This experience for Gloria was the fulfillment of a childhood dream. As a young person Gloria had set life goals and one of these ambitions was to dance overseas and share her culture with the world. Her first performance in China meant the achievement of this dream and she danced through tears of joy and pride.

Gloria is a proud representative of her Gumbaynggirr culture and a passionate dancer. Gloria left Coffs Harbour as a young seventeen year old girl to join the Naisda Dance Company in Sydney, an example of her courage and commitment. In her life Gloria has embraced any opportunity offered to her even if she has felt nervous or scared at the time, and continues to set herself goals. This trip, learning about the Chinese culture and the struggles of the people, has enriched Gloria's appreciation of her own culture. She knows she will remember this experience forever and believes that dreams can come true.

Toormina High School had students playing in Group 2 Junior Rugby League Premiership winning teams recently.


