Congratulations to Hayden O'Rourke, year 10, on receiving an ABCN Foundation Scholarship. Hayden is one of the 35 scholars forming the 2020 cohort.

The Australian Business and Community Network (ABCN) Foundation Accelerate Scholarship Program is a three-year program that targets exceptional students who are facing economic, family or social challenges. The scholarship entitles Hayden to \$7000 distributed over three years - \$2,000 in Year 11, \$2,000 in Year 12 and \$3,000 in his first year of further education or training. The scholarship funds can be used to cover any fees or costs associated with education.

Hayden will also receive a dedicated mentor who is a corporate professional from ABCN's network of member companies and funders. The mentor's role is to assist in planning, understanding the world of work and helping prepare for the final years of school and first year of study or work.



In the first year of the program, Hayden wii participate in a Leadership Summit, with the other 2020 Accelerate Scholars and mentors from across the country to work on leadership skills and strategies.

Supporting Transition to Post School Life

Schools are farewelling their Year 12
Graduates this term and for some student's with disability the move into the post school environment requires support. The NDIS are keen to link up with students with disability leaving school. You can contact the local Support Teacher Transition or the NDIS Coordinator in your area (see below).

The National Disability Insurance Agency would like to invite school leavers and their families to attend a virtual information session.

This session will provide an opportunity to hear about supports available through the NDIS to support transition to post-school life and employment. Learn how to prepare for a conversation about your goals and things to consider when choosing the right provider for you. This session will have a maximum capacity of 300 attendees.

The session will be delivered via videoconference using Microsoft Teams. Registrations will close three business days prior to each session. Students with disabilities benefit from early transition planning. Year 11 student's with disability need to prepare for their post school future and this may include accessing the NDIS.

Let's Talk About Work

The NDIS can consider funding supports to build employment skills prior to the student leaving school.

For example community participation supports, can also be used to build skills and take important steps to employment. A community participation provider could help students learn how to catch public transport, meet new people or manage money. Gaining confidence in these areas might be the first step in the employment journey.
