YEAR 7 VACCINATIONS



Dear Parent/Guardian

If your child has not been vaccinated at the school vaccination clinic and you would like for them to be vaccinated

Our team of specially trained registered nurses will be re-visiting your child's school on 20 October 2020 to offer free vaccinations against serious vaccine preventable diseases.

Vaccines include:

Human Papillomavirus (HPV) vaccine

Diphtheria-Tetanus-Pertussis (dTpa) vaccine

What do you need to do?

- √ Read Year 7 Vaccination Information Kit
- Complete the Consent Form in BLOCK letters using a BLACK or BLUE pen
- Sign the Consent Form for EACH vaccine your child requires
- Return the signed Consent Form to your child to return to school, as soon as possible
- Discuss the importance of vaccinations with your child
- V Ensure your child has breakfast on the morning of








Tap on the relevant student.
