Sentral Parent and Student Portal


Year 7 parents should now have received instructions and their Access Key for the Sentral for Parents app. Parents of other Year groups would have received this with the mailout of School Reports last year.

We encourage all parents to register & enter their unique Access Key to their child's information. This will enable more efficient communication between our school and parents.

We have so far released Timetables, Attendance data (including Absence notifications), School Reports, a Newsfeed and "Activities" that students are involved in. We will be utilising more of the functionality in the Sentral Parent and Student Portal during this year.

Students have recently been handed a print out of revised timetables. The latest up to date timetables are always available online in Sentral. Here is how to view your child's timetable in the Sentral for Parents mobile phone app. (see diagram on next page)

The easiest way for students to access their timetable is to go to our school website, click on Links, then click on Sentral for Students and Parents. All students are automatically provided with a Sentral account and should log in with their school user ID (NOT email), e.g. joe.citizen3 and their school password.

Respectful communication is a right
